How do I set myself up to study?



What equipment do I need?

OU learning is delivered via the module website, so you will need access to the internet. You'll also need a <u>desktop or laptop</u> <u>computer</u> and you can check course-specific requirements on your module website. If you don't have your own device, you should be able to use one at your local library or <u>Digital Inclusion</u> Hub.



What digital skills do I need?

You will need to have basic digital skills to study with the OU. If you need some help, then the 'Being Digital' resource from our Library is a great place to start. Alternatively, support with improving your skills is available via our Help Centre, which also provides guidance on getting set up for online study.



Where do I study?

The OU gives you flexibility to study when and where it suits you. If you're squeezed for space at home, try a café, library or <u>Digital Inclusion Hub</u>. As an OU student, you can also use a library at a University near you if you sign up to the <u>SCONUL Access scheme</u>. This <u>video</u> explains how it works.



Can I get help with costs?

You may be eligible for funding towards any of your <u>study-related</u> <u>costs</u>, including devices and broadband. Other <u>financial support</u> is available too.
