


Governance and Committees at the Open University



Introduction

- A university governance system refers to the structure and processes through which a university is organized, managed, and administered.
- This system involves individuals like you, committees, and governing bodies, that work together to make decisions, set policies, and ensure the overall wellbeing of the institution.
- Effective university governance systems strive to balance the diverse interests and perspectives of these stakeholders, ensuring transparency, accountability, and responsiveness to the needs of the academic community and society at large.







Key components



Student Senate Reference Group (SSRG)

Student representatives participate in decision-making processes related to student affairs, services, and policies acting as an advisory group to the Senate 6.

The Senate 6 are students elected and appointed to attend Senate to represent the student body.

Senate

The academic senate is composed of elected representatives from the university's faculty including the most senior management and leaders.

It plays a crucial role in academic decision-making, such as curriculum development, program approval, and academic policies.

Council

This is the highest governing body responsible for overseeing the university's overall direction and everything reports into council at a high level.


Members are typically appointed or elected and may include individuals from diverse backgrounds, including business, education, and community leaders.



A quick sumary

- Governance is a way of describing a system of committees, that work together to make decisions about the overall future well-being of the institution.
- Student reps are appointed and some ex officio members (there because of their position 'in office') of OU governance committees, but all contribute throughout the different levels of governance.
- Students are there as members to provide the student perspective at the highest level of governance to impact change for now and in the future.

Academic Committee

The purpose of the Academic Committee, Learning Teaching and Assessment (ACLTA) is to:

- Oversee the creation and implementation of modules and monitor effectiveness.
- Ensure that appropriate actions and innovations take place.
- Produce an annual report to the Academic Committee and make recommendations for improvement and enhancement.

Some examples of matters impacting students that you will encounter are -

 Reports provided by the Board of Studies about the quality of their qualifications, Partnership arrangements and Qualification specifications for new ways of teaching.

- 1 elected Student Faculty Rep (FAR) appointed student representatives.
- Each faculty has an Academic Comm (5 in total).
- Deans, Directors of Teaching, Associated Lecturers, Student Support Staff Lead Student Service areas attend.



Boards of Study

The purpose of the Board of Study (BoS) is to:

- Oversee the creation and implementation of modules and monitor effectiveness.
- Ensure that appropriate actions and innovations take place.
- Produce an annual report to the Academic Committee and make recommendations for improvement and enhancement.
- Feed up to the Academic Committee, Learning, Teaching and Assessment.

Some examples of matters impacting students that you will encounter are -


- Flexible study options

- Deans, Associate Lecturers, Student Support Staff Leads, Student Service such as the Library and Careers atter



Faculty Assembly

- 3 Appointed student reps and there are 4 Faculty Assemblies.
- Purpose is to provide all members of the faculty with updates regarding the day-to-day activities, achievements and plans.
- Much larger meeting with all staff once per quarter.
- No formal report to write after meeting but encourage you to share on forums.
